Correspondence was read and received from the Council acknowledging the appointment of Mr Taylor as the Parks Committee.

Moved by Mr Poiet, Seconded by Mr Small, it was resolved that the Health Officer of Willoughby Municipal Council be informed of the dumping of garbage, and rubbish in general, in various waste areas of Willoughby, resulting in a considerable increase of the fly nuisance with consequent prejudice to the health of the community, and that the Health Officer be informed that the Castlecrag Progress Association recommends that the collection of garbage from every house be made compulsory, and paid for out of the rates, additional rates being raised for that purpose if necessary, and that the foregoing be communicated to the Secretary of the Federation.
