Correspondence was read and received. It included letters to town clerk Willoughby re construction of lighting of certain streets – also buss [sic] service. Correspondence was received.

It was moved by Mr Borril, seconded by Mr Solomon, that the Association ask the treasurer to deliver up the books – carried.

There followed a discussion of the buss service. It was moved by Mr Solomon, seconded by Mr Borril, that it be left in the hands of Mr Herbert to call a meeting if it were necessary to go on with the buss petition and no definite news of the return of the busses was received.

Re the railroad, Mr Herbert stated he was conferring with Mr Bayles about an alternate route while Mr Griffin was collecting data for it.

Mrs Solomon, chairman of the School Committee, gave a report on the visit of Mr Riley, the Inspector of Schools. Mr Riley, she said, pointed out that the interests of the peninsular only were to be served and there did not seem to be enough representatives from this position. He advised recanvassing this district and asked for further information re available sites. A note of thanks was moved to the School Committee for their work.
