Traffic Management Update

The Castlecrag Progress Association campaigned for improvements to Edinburgh Road at its first meeting in 1924, and this has remained an issue of concern to our residents ever since. Detailed proposals were developed for traffic calming in the 1970s and during the 1990s a local area traffic management (LATM) committee of local residents developed proposals based on community concerns. Finally, we have good news to report on this matter.

Council's Traffic and Transport Engineers Tony Lehmann and James Brocklebank met with Progress Association Committee members on 25 September to discuss their schedule for the implementation of the recommendations arising from the Edinburgh Road/Sunnyside Crescent LATM.

Council has been successful in attracting \$80,000 RTA funding for the works and it will match this funding to ensure it is spent

by the end of June 2003. The LATM will follow the recommendations of the 1998 consultants' report which were presented to large public meetings at the time. They included:

- a roundabout at the intersection of Edinburgh Road and Rutland Avenue.
- three strategically located slowpoints/pedestrian refuges between Rutland Road and Linden Way to reduce speeds and assist pedestrians
- minor works in Sunnyside Crescent to address localised safety concerns
- lobbying the RTA for a right turn arrow at the Edinburgh Road/Eastern Valley Way traffic lights. (This lobbying has so far been unsuccessful.)
- the implementation of a bicycle route along Edinburgh Road.

Council's Surveyors have completed their work and a design and community

consultation schedule has been prepared to allow the works to be completed within this time frame. The schedule includes:

October 2002

- discussions with Council's Bicycle Consultative Committee on 24 October
- referral of initial design plans to Council's Traffic Committee on 20 November
- discussions with Ward Councillors and Progress Association representatives in late November 2002.

Consultation with the community will occur from early December through to mid February 2003. During this time the proposed devices will be painted on the road to allow people to gauge the impact of the works. Designs will be amended and again referred to Council's Traffic Committee on 19 February 2003. Final approval will be sought from the full Council on 10 March 2003.
