

The leaves, stems, branches and roots of Camphor laurel (<u>Cinnamomum camphora</u>) are all aromatic. They smell strongly of camphor. Next time you see a Camphor laurel, crush a leaf and smell it.

Introduction and spread: A native tree of China and Japan, Camphor laurel was introduced into Australia and established in the Botanic Gardens by the 1850s. By the 1890s it was 'growing like a weed' around Sydney. Extensive ornamental plantings were made in NSW and Queensland from seeds or seedlings supplied by the Botanic Gardens and the State Forest nurseries. School grounds and many municipal parks were planted with the tree.

The species was widely used as a shade tree and for shelter belts in the Richmond-Tweed region in an attempt to restore the landscape after the removal of the last remnants of the 'big scrub'. It is now estimated that there are 200,000 mature trees in the Richmond-Tweed area. A 15-20 year old mature tree produces about 113,000 black, globular berries, which are spread by currawongs, pigeons, and fig birds.

These trees have few pests and are stable during strong winds. However, their shade is complete and few plants can exist around them. Their leaves are toxic to many plants (Phytoalexins). They have a vigorous root system.

A <u>successful weed</u>: Camphor laurel is now considered an undesirable plant. It has all the attributes of a successful weed species in its excellent adaptation to a disturbed environment, abundant seed production, effective dispersal, and rapid growth rate. Where it occurs near native bushland, it soon colonises to the almost total exclusion of native flora.

Removal: Because of its invasive character and its detrimental effect on native plants in our bushland reserves, large mature trees should be progressively removed from our schools, streets and private gardens as well as bushland. However, because Camphor laurels are trees they are covered by Council's Tree Preservation Order and permission to remove them must be obtained. Smaller trees and seedlings can be readily removed by pulling, digging or use of a mattock. However, any roots left in the ground close to the surface, will shoot. Large trees can be poisoned with 'Roundup' by painting the poison into a series of chisel or saw cuts around the trunk (reference should be make to the manufacturer's instructions). If the tree is cut down the stump top should be painted immediately with the poison. Large trees have a massive root system and unless you are really fit, leave the stump in the ground or obtain professional advice. Similar methods can be used for privet and lantana (see previous issues of The Craq).


